Hayley Bendl again outstanding with three medals. Hayley took Silver in the regional 4x400m relay, and Bronze in both the 16 years 800m and 1500m. The gold medallist in the 1500m broke the Australian age record giving an indication of the strength of the field.

Tom O'Brien-Freeman competed in the junior MC division and earned bronze in both the long jump and javelin.
